

New Technology For Your Comfort, Safety & Peace of Mind

HVAC contractors have an awesome responsibility. It's a responsibility that we take very seriously at Halco. As the title notes, you look to us for the comfort, safety and peace of mind of your family.

With increasing frequency, we are turning to technology to help us in our mission. One such high tech piece of equipment is pictured here. It's a television camera that allows us to view inside your furnace and your ducts.

As Ed Thrash demonstrates, this tiny television camera on the end of a flexible tube can be snaked through inside of the furnace to show him the inner workings, including the heat exchanger. You can then see the same thing he does by viewing the monitor, which is on Ed's left in the photo.

The "low tech" way of checking heat exchangers is to use a flashlight and mirror. Now all of our service



technicians carry these minicameras on their trucks.

Checking the condition of the heat exchanger is an important part of annual furnace maintenance. Over time this barrier between combustion and comfort can become cracked or holes can develop. When working properly, the gasses of combustion remain on one side of the exchanger while the air that circulates through your home is on the other side. The circulating air is warmed through the metal of the heat exchanger, while the gases of

combustion, particularly deadly carbon monoxide, are vented through the flue or chimney.

If a heat exchanger does develop defects, carbon monoxide can leak into the air flowing into your home.

Our technician can view the heat exchanger in two modes, visually and with

infrared. Cracks or holes will show up on the monitor as hot spots in the infrared mode.

This camera can also be pushed through your ductwork to check on whether your ducts need cleaning. It has actually saved some of our customers money by showing that their ducts do not need cleaning.

As we lament the fare on television in our living room, isn't it wonderful to know that the same technology in the hands of a furnace technician could actually save your life.

Annual Furnace Cleaning Is Inexpensive Inursance

Having your furnace cleaned each year is as important to your health as an annual physical or visit to you dentist. It is during these cleanings that service technicians check for problems, as well as remove dirt, adjust the flame and tune up your furnace.

One of the problems for which our technicians check is cracks in the heat exchanger. The high tech method they use is detailed on page one. Cracks or other holes in the heat exchanger can cause carbon monoxide (CO) – a colorless, odorless, deadly gas – to leak

into your home. This is why furnace cleaning is as important to your health as your physical. Both can be a matter of life or death.

Adjusting the flame is important to your wallet. Improperly adjusted burners can use more fuel than necessary. As a result, your utility bills may be much higher than necessary.

This is why we say that an annual furnace cleaning is inexpensive insurance for your family's health, comfort and economy.

Carbon monoxide detectors are quite popular. We believe, however, that many provide false security.

Our technicians have very sophisticated CO detectors costing hundreds of dollars. But, those sold for home use are often as little as \$20 or \$30. Do you want to stake your family's life on a cheap detector?

It is our position that a CO detector is fine, if it is used in conjunction with annual furnace maintenance.

Our Night Work Grows

There's activity at Halco headquarters 24 hours a day, and that activity continues to grow. Our overnight fabrication crew is now manufacturing metal curbs, which are used primarily for commercial rooftop air conditioners. This is in addition to their traditional fabrication work.

This move required a substantial investment in tools for working with aluminum, including a MIG welder and plasma cutter.

We have also added a vehicle maintenance department. Our mechanic, who works overnight, performs preventive maintenance on our fleet of 35 vehicles. This way, trucks don't have to be out of service during the day for routine maintenance.

Expanding our nighttime fabricating business, assures you of a knowledge-able Halco person on the other end of the line whenever you call, and doing our own vehicle maintenance helps assure that a truck is available for prompt service when you need us.

The Buttons weren't disappointed, either. Shortly after the installation, a guest complained that there was no hot water. A 7:00 p.m. call to Halco brought a technician right out, and the problem was fixed before the guests returned from dinner.

A circuit was labeled "organ". Since

there is no organ in the B&B, it was assumed to be an unused circuit that could be claimed for the air conditioning. But, a hot water heater dedicated to just that room was on that circuit.

The Buttons have no plans to air condition the lower level. They only serve breakfast, so the thick walls and many trees keep that floor cool naturally.

While becoming an increasingly important part of the Canandaigua hospitality industry, the Buttons are also able to spend time with their daughter and her family, who live in Fairport.

Unclogging Clogs the High Tech Way

In the photo, Randy Marks demonstrates the Jetter, our new high pressure pipe cleaner.

This new \$4,000 tool, manufactured by the Rigid Tool Company, cleans pipes of any size and any material.

The Jetter cleans better than an auger or snake, and it is less damaging to the pipe.

No mechanical device touches the pipe



or the clog with the Jetter. The wand simply shoots a very high pressure blast of water into the pipe, and pipe is built to carry water.

An auger or snake simply dislodges the obstruction by scraping against the wall of the pipe. Sometimes the obstructive material remains in large chunks, rather than breaking up into smaller, flushable pieces. Once dislodged, water at higher than normal household pressure still has to pass through the pipe to keep the material from adhering to the pipe further down the line.

The Jetter uses high pressure water as the dislodging medium, so it breaks the clogging material up into very small pieces and flushes it away all at once.

When used with another of our high tech Rigid tools, the See SnakeTM, our plumbers can also see what is causing the clog, locate where it is, and be sure that the Jetter cleaned away everything and that the obstruction is clear.
