The six-day course trained Hal in building science, and prepared him to consider the complete environment when designing the heating and air conditioning systems for a building.

The course, which was taught at Monroe BOCES II in Spencerport, included hands-on experience as well as lectures. Testing was conducted throughout the process.

Farmington Woman Spells Allergy Relief H-A-L-C-O

Carmella Bell was satisfied heating her Farmington home with a wood stove and electric baseboard. But, she was one of those people who began suffering from allergies well into adulthood.

As the allergies got worse, her doctor advised her to convert her heating system to a furnace with high efficiency filtration. He wasn't too pleased with her constantly having to run up and down stairs to stoke the stove, which used 18 face cords of wood every year. So, this spring, Carmella called Halco to give her allergy relief.

We installed a high efficiency, Westinghouse, two-stage furnace; a Westinghouse air conditioner; Aprilaire high efficiency charcoal filter; and ultra violet air purifier. The system is controlled by a Robert Shaw programmable thermostat.

We also arranged for a new propanefired water heater. That area of Farmington has no natural gas lines, so the new furnace is also propane-fired.

This was not an easy job of simply "changing-out" an old furnace. Since the house never had forced air heat, we had to fabricate and install new ductwork throughout.

Within days, however, Carmella noticed the difference in her indoor air quality. For those days in which neither heat nor air conditioning is needed, the system allows the fan to run continually, filtering air through the charcoal filter and UV light. This reduces allergies in the air for year round comfort.
