Halco Named To Century Club

The Home Performance with ENERGY STAR Program, sponsored locally by the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA), offers homeowners a comprehensive, whole house approach to improving energy efficiency and comfort. As a participating contractor in NY-SERDA's program, Halco receives specialized training and is equipped with diagnostic tools to inspect homes inside and out to determine where improvements are needed. Halco Tests New BPI Certifications

College faculty members taught the draft curriculum to the Halco professionals and administered the certification tests. Our people then critiqued the course content and test questions for clarity, accuracy and applicability. These comments will be considered when the final curriculum and exams are written.

As a result of their work on the program, the five Halco are among the first to receive this latest BPI certification.

All of the Halco Beta Testers have earned Building Analyst and Building Envelope Professional certifications, which qualify them to perform Comprehensive Home Assessments. In addition, Hal and Dave have earned Heating Professional and Hal has earned Air Conditioning Professional certification as well. These and the new insulation and air sealing certification qualify them to design improvements when indicated by the assessments.

Three Earn BPI Certification

Halco Wins NCI Training Excellence Award

The National Comfort Institute (NCI) has honored Halco with its 2010 National Training Excellence Award. NCI Chairman Rob Falke presented the award to Hal Smith at NCI's annual conference in Austin, TX.

Entrants had to meet three criteria to be considered for the award. Training had to be part of their corporate culture. They also had to maintain state of the art training facilities and invest heavily in internal and external training.

Halco leads the industry in training. Our 115 employees completed an average of 120 hours of training over the last 12 months. Moreover, each employee has a career path and the company works with them to create an ongoing training program to assure that each will meet his/her career goals.

Halco's training center is a dedicated facility used for New York State apprenticeship training for Halco employees and for training displaced and under employed workers. The latter program is conducted in partnership with Monroe Community College.

Nearly 80 percent of Halco's technicians are NATE certified, and many have earned certifications in a number of specialties.



In addition, Halco conducts intensive training through the National Center For Construction Education & Research, OSHA safety training programs and customer service training for the company's 81 employees who have customer contract.

Halco employees have also been trained and certified by the Building Performance Institute (BPI) to conduct residential energy conservation audits. Two technicians have been trained and certified by the EPA in asbestos removal and transport, enabling the company to offer residential and small commercial customers asbestos abatement at a reasonable cost.

This is not the first time Halco has been

honored for its training program. ACCA (Air Conditioning Contractors of America) bestowed its 2008 excellence in training award on Halco, and a national trade magazine recognized the company as the best contractor to work for in the northeast. That award also was based on Halco's many training opportunities.

Training Center Expands Home Energy Performance Course Offerings

As the first class prepares to graduate from the newly renamed Finger Lakes Home Performance Training Center, Halco and our partner, Monroe Community College, have announced an expanded curriculum.

The new curriculum is designed to prepare students for the advent of several new energy saving programs that will soon be announced on both the federal and state level. The federal program is called Home Star and the two state programs are Green Jobs and Green New York.

The new semester will begin shortly after graduation and students can select from three levels of education. In the first program, students will learn basics and will earn the basic BPI certification – Building Analyst Professional.

Students who complete this curriculum will be qualified to work as insulation installers and other hands-on jobs.

The second level will introduce students to more advanced subjects and will include BPI Building Envelope Professional and Mobile Home Specialist certification. This level will qualify the graduate for a supervisory position.

The third level will teach more advanced air home performance testing procedures and introduce them to renewable energy systems. It will also lead to BPI Heating Specialist and Air Conditioning/Heat Pump Specialist certification, and qualify the person for a home performance auditor's position.

Retired Teacher Goes Solar & Saves On Electric Bill

Gerry and Susan Benedict have lived in a log home in Newark since 1983. Gerry proudly explains that all of the logs came from the property. The yard is nicely landscaped and the garden even sports tropical plants like bananas. (Of course the tropicals have to be taken indoors in the winter.)

Recently, two towers, each containing 16 solar panels, rose at the back of the property, and Gerry happily watches his electric meter spin backwards as the solar system returns excess power to the utility grid.

cells (solar panels) is transmitted by buried wires into house where it enters an inverter that converts it to alternating current. The power then goes through a special electric meter before being distributed within the house and grounds or sent to the grid.

Gerry is a retired science teacher who enjoys both the physical science surrounding his new solar system and the natural sciences, which drives his gardening passion.

After reading in this newsletter and other Halco material about the energy saving benefits of a Comprehensive Home As-

sessment, he contacted Halco and, last July, Larry Williamson conducted the assessment. Solar power was one of the alternatives to reduce electric bills.

The system is monitored through the Internet. Gerry and Halco can both monitor its performance through their computers.


